It's HOT Outside! HUMANE SOCIETY/SPCA OFFERS HOT WEATHER TIPS TO PET OWNERS

(San Antonio, TX)- When temperatures reach over 90 degrees, the Humane Society/SPCA of Bexar County would like to offer tips to pet owners so they may keep their companions cool, safe, and healthy during this time:

Dogs and cats should be kept inside the house if possible during the day. If bringing in an animal that is usually outside, set up an area in the laundry room, bathroom, or carrier to keep him from getting into mischief.

Animals that must be kept outdoors please protect them from the heat by supplying shade, cool water, and check on your pet often. Always remember that a common cause of heatstroke is leaving a pet unattended in the car, so keep your pets at home when doing errands.

Cats and kittens will often look for cool spots if left outside. Check under your car before driving and make sure when closing the garage door, you have no animals inside. With no circulation, your garage can be a death trap for your pet or stray.
